How to use this CD-ROM

All the documents included on this CD-ROM are in the Acrobat file format and can be viewed using Acrobat Reader. No other software is needed.

The start page has links on the left side leading you to the respective pages which will open with a bookmark column on the left, similar to the one you can see now. These bookmarks allow you to navigate back up in the hierarchy.

The documents themselves use two kinds of links: Plain links that are <u>blue</u> and links that are <u>blue</u> and <u>underlined</u>. Plain blue links are links within documents on the CD-ROM, whereas underlined blue links will lead you to the respective Internet-sites or they are e-mail address links.

The papers and posters presented can be accessed via two paths:

- 1. under sections the authors and their papers are listed according to the program
- 2. under authors the first authors are listed alphabetically

The CD also offers an index function, which allows you to search the CD-ROM, using your own search words. How to use this function is explained under search.

Certainly, the papers can be printed out. Since the formatting is rather large, it is probably useful to print two pages side by side on one paper, provided your printer offers such a function.
